

AstraFemina works with our partner organizations to amplify their outreach efforts. Through venues such as personal appearances, video forums, and online experiences, we reach large groups of girls and young women, showing them the benefits of STEM as a career choice.

By sharing our stories and offering advice, we hope to encourage them to overcome stereotypes, biases, and unwelcoming environments and prove that STEM isn't just a "boy thing." In fact, we need more girls to follow in our footsteps, harnessing their bright young minds to become a dynamic force in STEM fields and make an impact in our world.

Like 2023, AstraFemina added new partners and members this year, following our plan of steady growth. Our members continued to participate in a mix of in-person and virtual events. The number of events in 2024 wasn't as high as we hoped, as one of our partners wasn't able to resume their virtual programs by the end of the year.

Working closely with WOW STEM (World of Women in STEM), we completed production of nine member video interviews. These videos are now on the AstraFemina and WOW STEM websites and are being shared on the WOW STEM social media platforms. In total, our videos have been viewed nearly 7,000 times since being posted in the middle of the year. Thanks to the WOW STEM team, a Girl Scout Badge Guide has been created based on these videos.

This year, the board initiated a mentoring effort for our members. We hosted a series of "Tell Your Story" workshops to help interested members craft the story of their journey to a career in STEM. Based on the positive feedback, we will continue to periodically hold these workshops.

Additionally, the board spent much of 2024 discussing a social media strategy, with the goal of increasing our presence on our social media platforms to build our brand, find more partners and members, and expand our fundraising. The board released a "request for proposal" to social media companies in November with the aim of hiring one of these companies by the end of January 2025.



Participated in 23 events in 2024. Since 2020, we have supported 137 engagements and reached over 30,000 girls.



Widened our areas of expertise, adding role models specializing in autonomous vehicles, bioinformatics and genome analysis, biomedical and chemical engineering, energy, marine biology, meteorology, physics, robotics, and software entrepreneurship.



Grew our partnerships to 16 non-profit organizations with STEM programs specifically designed to inspire girls and young women.
