Stacey Berg is a medical doctor who specializes in care for children with cancer. She is a professor of pediatrics at Texas Children's Hospital, Baylor College of Medicine. She has a special interest in research on new anticancer drugs.

Dr. Berg grew up in Pittsburgh, PA. She attended Harvard College, where she majored in English and American Literature and Language, then went to medical school at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. She then completed her residency in Pediatrics at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, followed by a fellowship in pediatric hematology-oncology at the National Cancer Institute.

Dr. Berg moved to Houston in 1994 to help start the Developmental Therapeutics Program at Texas Children's Cancer Center, Texas Children's Hospital. This program works to discover new treatments for childhood cancer. Dr. Berg and her colleagues perform laboratory studies and also conduct clinical trials to define the safety and efficacy of new anticancer drugs in children. In addition, Dr. Berg is dedicated to training the next generation of physician-researchers in pediatric oncology.
